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**The ascension of (14) martyrs in Jerusalem
governorate**

(286) arrests and (18) demolitions

**(2826) settlers stormed the blessed
Al_Aqsa_ mosque during November of the
year 2023**

Martyrs and the file of bodies detained by the occupation:

During November 2023, 14 martyrs were martyred in the Jerusalem governorate, including 4 children, in addition to three of them from Hebron governorate, and a liberated Jerusalemite prisoner deported to the Gaza Strip was also martyred.

On the second of November, the young Yazan Shiha (23 years old), who is from the town of Anata in Occupied Jerusalem, rose after the occupation forces stormed the beer area and fired live bullets randomly at those present, which led to his injury and martyrdom. The occupation forces fired tear gas at the funeral home of the martyr Yazan Shiha in Anata town and prevented his stay at the Anata Girls basic school.

On the third of November, the young Ibrahim Zayed (29 years old) rose after the occupation forces stormed the Qalandia camp north of Occupied Jerusalem, and the occupation fired bullets towards Zayed, which led to his chest and abdomen injury and then martyrdom.

On the fifth of November, 4 martyrs were martyred in the towns of Abu Dis and Eizariya in Occupied Jerusalem. In the town of Abu Dis, severe confrontations broke out with the occupation forces from dawn until the morning hours, followed by the ascension of Nabil Halabiya (20 years old), the occupation detained the body of the martyrs of Halabiya, Muhannad Afana (20 years old), Musa Zaarour (22 years old), and in Eizariya, the child martyr Rami Odeh (17 years old) was injured by the occupation bullets earlier.

On November 6, a 16-year-old child, Mohammed Omar Ghanam Farukh, came from the town of al-Issawiya, after the occupation forces shot him, under the pretext of "carrying out a stabbing attack at the Salah al-Din Street police station of the occupation. The occupation detained the body of the child Farukh.

On November 6, a 16-year-old child, Musab Mujahid Kamel al-Matari, climbed after being hit by live Israeli bullets on Jabal al-jubayah near the wall in Beit Anan, northwest of Occupied Jerusalem. The occupation had detained al-Matari for two hours and prevented his medical assistance.

On November 16, 3 Palestinian youths from Hebron climbed at the tunnel barrier separating the cities of Jerusalem and Bethlehem, after an armed clash with the occupation forces, namely: Abdul Qader Al-Qawasmi, Nasrallah al-Qawasmi, and Hassan qufisha.

On November 25, the freed prisoner, Mohammed Ibrahim Hamada (46 years old), who was deported from the city of Jerusalem, rose during the Israeli bombardment on the Gaza Strip. It is noteworthy that the martyr Mohammed Hamada was arrested by the occupation during the month of August 1997, and sentenced to 28 years in prison, of which he spent 14 years, and was freed in the "Wafa al-Ahrar" deal, and deported to the Gaza Strip.

On the same day, a 16-year-old Jerusalemite child, Mohammed Riad Saleh, was injured by Israeli occupation forces in the Jabal al-Taweel area of Al-Bireh city (Ramallah). the occupation forces shot the child after they stopped him, then left him on the ground and prevented his ambulance, and then arrested him and announced his martyrdom later.

On November 30, two brothers, Ibrahim Nimr (30 years old) and Murad Nimr (38 years old), who are from the town of surbahir, went up after a shooting operation in the occupied city of Jerusalem, and the occupation detained their bodies.

The file of the bodies of the martyrs detained

During the month of November, the occupation detained the bodies of 4 martyrs, namely: the young Nabil Halabiya, the child Mohammed Farukh, the two brothers Ibrahim and Murad Nimr.

Until the end of November 2023, the occupation authorities are still detaining the bodies of 34 holy martyrs in the occupation refrigerators and cemeteries of figures, namely: The martyr (Nabil Halabiya), the martyr the child (Mohammed Farrukh), the two brother martyrs (Ibrahim and Mawad Nimr), the martyr (Ali Abbasi), the martyr (the child Abdul Rahman Faraj), the martyr (Khaled al-Muhtaseb), the martyr (the child Adam Abu al-Hawa), the martyr (Abdul Rahman Al-Amouri), the martyr (the child Khaled al-Zaanin), the martyr (Muhannad al-Mazraa), the martyr (Ishaq Al-Ajlouni),

the martyr (Hussein qaraqqa), the martyr (Khairy Alqam), rose during the year 2023, the martyr (Barakat Odeh), the martyr (Habas Rayyan), the martyr (Amer Halabiya), the martyr (Adi Tamimi), the martyr (Karim Al-qawasimi) rose during the year 2022, the martyr (Fadi Abu shakhidem), the martyr (Mahmoud Humaidan), the Martyr (Ahmad Zahran), the martyr (Zakaria Badwan) and the martyr (Shaher Abu Khadija) and the martyr (the child Zuhdi al-Tawil) rose during 2021, the Martyr (Ahmed Erekat) and the martyr (Ibrahim halsa) rose during 2020, the martyr (the captive Aziz aweysat) who rose in 2018, the martyr (Fadi Qanbar) in 2017, the martyr (Mesbah Abu Sabih) in 2016, the martyr (Nabil Halabiya) and the martyr (Osama Bahr) rose during 2001, the martyr (Kamil Mazzaro) in 1986, and the martyr Jasser shtat in 1968.

Targeting national figures

During the month of November, the occupation authorities continued their violations against the governor of Jerusalem, Adnan Ghaith. on November 14, the occupation forces stormed Ghaith's house in Silwan, occupied Jerusalem. it is noteworthy that the occupation has been imposing open house arrest on Governor Ghaith at his home in Silwan, since August 4, 2022. the occupation prosecution filed an indictment against him, which included (17) violations of the decision to prevent him from entering the West Bank from the moment the decision was issued, and the occupation prosecution demands that he be transferred to actual prison, in addition to four other previous military decisions issued against Governor Ghaith since he assumed his duties as governor of Jerusalem in 2018, he has been periodically renewed for five years now.

On November 16, the so-called minister of the interior of the occupation ordered to begin the procedures of "withdrawing the blue identity" of the two Jerusalemite prisoners Majid Al-Jabba and Rashid Al-rishk under the pretext of "belonging to banned organizations," noting that Al-Jabba and Al-rishk have been subjected to several arrests and prosecutions for years.

Settler attacks

During November, the Jerusalem governorate monitored about (4) attacks by settlers. On November 6, a number of settlers attacked lands belonging to the Armenian Patriarchate in Occupied Jerusalem, estimated at (11 thousand meters), and the residents of the neighborhood confronted them and removed them from the land.

On November 13, settlers belonging to the so-called Nature Authority of the occupation and the "Elad" Settlement Association continued to harvest olives from Jerusalemite trees in Wadi Rababa in Silwan town south of Al-Aqsa Mosque.

On November 15, settlers with bulldozers attacked the Armenian Quarter in the Old City of Occupied Jerusalem.

On November 30, the guards of the blessed Al-Aqsa Mosque arrested a settler in civilian clothes carrying a knife after suspecting him while entering from Bab al-qattanin and handed him over to the occupation police at Bab al-qattanin, one of the doors of the Al-Aqsa Mosque.

Recorded injuries

During November, the Jerusalem governorate monitored the injuries resulting from the use of excessive force by the occupation forces against Jerusalemites in various parts of the occupied capital. (22) injuries were detected as a result of live and rubber-coated metal bullets and severe beatings by the occupation forces, in addition to hundreds of cases of gas suffocation.

The crimes of the occupation and its settlers against the blessed Al-Aqsa Mosque

During November of the year 2023, 2826 settlers and 694 foreigners under the name of tourism (through the Israeli Ministry of Tourism) stormed the blessed Al-Aqsa Mosque with tight protection from heavily armed special occupation forces. This is the highest number of break-ins during the current year.

For the second month in a row, the occupation authorities continued to impose their strict restrictions on the entry of Muslims to the blessed Al-

Aqsa-mosque. During the month of November, the occupation forces, who are present at the doors of Al-Aqsa Mosque, prevented entry to the mosque except for a few elderly people. the occupation forces often require that entry be for the elderly only "residents of the Old Town", and the few numbers who manage to enter Al-Aqsa Mosque suffer from the arrest of the occupation forces, searching their bags, and checking their identities. The occupation authorities prevented Muslims from entering Al-Aqsa and praying there, while allowing settlers to storm it during the morning and afternoon incursions, and their prayers continue in the mosque.

The occupation authorities tightened their measures and restrictions on the streets of Jerusalem and nearby neighborhoods to prevent worshippers from reaching the blessed Al-Aqsa-mosque during the Friday days that coincided (November 3, 10, 17, 24), and the numbers of worshippers who managed to reach the Al-Aqsa-mosque during the said combination ranged from 4000-5000 worshipers only. According to the Jordanian Waqf, the numbers performing Friday prayers are few compared to before the Israeli aggression on Gaza, where more than 50 thousand worshipers performed them, and the rest of the prayers, such as Fajr, from 5 thousand worshipers, their number reached almost 200, and some prayers do not exceed 120 worshipers as a result of the blockade.

The occupation forces continued to prevent the access of young people to the Old City and the Al-Aqsa Mosque, and also continued to prevent the holding of prayers on Fridays in the streets of Occupied Jerusalem, suppressed prayers on more than one occasion and attacked worshippers with sound and gas bombs and wastewater, in the neighborhoods of Wadi al-Joz and Ras al-Amud neighborhood, the alleys of the Old City, at the gates of Al-Aqsa and in the area of Bab al-Asbat.

On November 14, as part of the incitement against Al-Aqsa and the dome of the rock and the Islamic presence in it, the right-wing Israeli journalist and one of the Temple Mount activists, Arnon Segal, published a photo of the soldiers of the Givati Brigade in the Legislative Council in Gaza and commented on it by saying: "soon we will raise the flag of Israel on the

dome of the rock itself," the extremist Tom Nissani, executive director of the pedino extremist Foundation, also attached that photo, and wrote on it "victory photo".

On November 30, a settler performed the ritual of "epic prostration" near the gate of mercy east of the Al-Aqsa Mosque after breaking into the mosque and praying with his group.

As part of the preservation and maintenance of Al-Aqsa, its landmarks and doors, the Islamic Waqf Department was able on November 25 to change the door of the tribes, one of the most famous doors of the Al-Aqsa Mosque, after the approval of the occupation police, the Department of Awqaf has been demanding the occupation for more than a year to change it, and there are also several worn and damaged doors that must be changed, but the occupation police only agreed to change only one door.

Arrest cases

During November 2023, about (286) arrests of citizens were monitored in all areas of the Jerusalem governorate, including 16 children and 13 women.

Decisions of the occupation courts against detainees: -

The occupation courts impose unfair decisions against detainees, ranging from issuing actual prison sentences, imposing house arrest, in addition to deportation decisions and heavy financial fines, and the occupation court issued travel bans against some of them, in addition to extending the detention of a large number of detainees for many months without clear charges being brought against them.

1. Actual prison sentences

During November 2023, the racist occupation courts issued (25) de facto prison sentences against Jerusalemite prisoners, including (19) administrative detention sentences "that is, without clearly specifying the charge against them," in addition to imposing very heavy financial fines that increase the suffering of their families.

2. Decisions on home detention

During November, 16 house arrest decisions issued by the occupation authorities against Jerusalemite citizens were monitored.

3. Deportation decisions

In November 2023, the occupation authorities issued two deportation orders.

Demolition, bulldozing and confiscation of property

The occupation authorities pursue a policy of demolishing the homes of citizens in Occupied Jerusalem, which comes in the context of the punitive measure, forced displacement and ethnic cleansing of citizens, and the Judaization and "captivity" of the occupied city, the occupation authorities justify the demolition of houses in general under the pretext of their residence without a license, despite the rarity of granting approval for the necessary licenses to build the homes of Jerusalemites.

During November 2023, the number of demolitions in the Jerusalem governorate reached (18) operations, including (9) forced self-demolitions and (9) demolitions carried out by occupation mechanisms, in addition to one bulldozing operation.

The demolitions carried out by the occupation mechanisms included: a house, two residential rooms, an apartment building under construction, a horse shed and a fence.

During the month of November, the occupation authorities carried out two bombings of the homes of the families of a prisoner and a martyr, and on November 8, the occupation forces blew up an apartment for the family of the child prisoner, "Mohammed Basil zalbani" in the Shuafat camp in Occupied Jerusalem. It is noteworthy that the apartment is located within a 4-storey residential building "the first floor is Shops and the other floors are residential apartments, on each floor there is an apartment" and 7 people live in the House. The Israeli occupation arrested zalbani last February and charged him with "attempting to carry out a stabbing and premeditated murder" during an occupation police officer searching and checking the identities of passengers inside a bus when it stopped at the military checkpoint.

On November 15, the occupation forces blew up the House of the martyr Khairy Alqam in Silwan, occupied Jerusalem, and the occupation stormed the House of the martyr Alqam and evacuated the 4-storey building and adjacent buildings in the Shiyah neighborhood in Silwan, occupied Jerusalem.

The occupying forces started planting explosives inside the House, imposed a siege on the house and its surroundings, closed all entrances leading to it, and informed the residents not to leave their homes at the moment of the explosion. The occupation closed the House of the martyr Alqam after it was blown up and no one was allowed to enter it. The martyr Alqam had risen at the beginning of this year after carrying out a shooting attack in the town of Beit Hanina in Occupied Jerusalem, and the occupation authorities are still detaining his body.

Decisions on demolition, forced eviction and land confiscation

During the first week of November, the occupation authorities handed over a number of demolition decisions in the town of Silwan in Occupied Jerusalem, the occupation forces stormed the family home of the Jerusalemite prisoner Imad abbaisan "Abbasi" and handed the family demolition decisions for shops belonging to the prisoner. In the Al-Bustan neighborhood of Silwan in Occupied Jerusalem, the occupation municipality handed over demolition orders for several houses.

Takeover attempts

In an attempt to secure the settlers' seizure of the land of the "cow Park", which is used as a parking lot for vehicles, the occupation forces stormed the Armenian neighborhood on November 16, and on November 30, the occupation forces removed the young Jerusalemite Armenian sitrak Balian (15) days from the land of the "cow Park" in the Armenian neighborhood inside the Old City wall of Occupied Jerusalem, threatened with diversion in favor of the settlers, due to a complaint from a settler.

Violations against prisoners

On the first of November, the occupation forces launched a campaign of raids and vandalism on the homes of liberated prisoners in Occupied

Jerusalem, and confiscated money and property, including: Osama al-rugby, Mohammed al-Shawish, Mohammed Al-Bakri, Ziad Abu hadwan, Ismail al-karkhi, Obada Najib, Hamza Abbasi, Bassam Idris, Hisham al-Bashiti, brothers Noah and Abdul-Jawad Al-Ghazawi.

The occupation forces also raided the House of the captured Jerusalemite MP Ahmed attun in the town of surbahir, searched it, vandalized its contents and confiscated a car.

The occupation forces confiscated the vehicle of the freed Jerusalemite prisoner Ahmed Sorour, imposed a fine of 170 thousand shekels on him, and handed him a summons for investigation, after breaking into his house in the town of Jabal al-Mukaber.

On November 13, the occupation municipality crews, Israeli forces and intelligence agents stormed the House of the freed prisoner Ibrahim Al-Abbasi and his two sons AMR and Ali and his daughter's house in Silwan and handed them building violations and the withdrawal of the license of two vehicles for the family.

The Special Forces of the occupation, the municipality of the occupation and the Tax Authority of the occupation stormed the building of the AL-Natsha family in the Ras al-Amud neighborhood in the occupied city of Jerusalem, and released dozens of violations against the freed prisoner Saif Al-Natsha. The occupation forces raided the House of the freed prisoner Seif, searched and vandalized its contents, then searched the yard of the house and issued several violations in the name of the freed Seif.

The amount of the violations amounted to more than 10 thousand shekels, namely:" the door of the building is tilted, a ladder is tilted inside the yard of the House, leaking water points from a pipe in the yard of the house, the presence of herbs and dust in the garden of the house, the cancellation of the license of a vehicle and its violation".

In addition, the occupation forces stormed the House of the freed prisoner Fuad al-Qaq in the Ain Al-Luza neighborhood of Silwan, searched the House, confiscated his vehicle, and assaulted his mother during the raid.

On November 20, the occupation forces stormed a house for freed prisoners in Issawiya, and searched it completely, and then imposed 7 violations on it ranging from 470-740 shekels, the violations were " the presence of a dryer in an inappropriate place, the storage of the house is not arranged, the presence of dirt on the roof of the house, in addition to the cancellation of vehicle and motorcycle licenses.

Release of prisoners from Jerusalem

The occupation authorities have released 79 Jerusalemite prisoners, including 24 women and 55 children (between 14 and 18 years old), as part of a prisoner exchange deal with the Palestinian resistance in Gaza. The deal included the release of the wounded child, who was under house arrest, Abdul Rahman zaghl (14 years old), the youngest prisoner, Ahmed Nawaf Salaima (14 years old) from Ras al-Amud, and the youngest prisoner, nethouf Hammad (16 years old) from Sheikh Jarrah, in addition to Jerusalemite women with high sentences, such as: Israa Jaabis, Merah Bakir, Shurooq dawayat, Fadwa Hamada, Amani Hashim, Nurhan Awad, the deal also included the release of the two and Khadija khois.

During the days of the deal, the occupation intelligence called the families of the prisoners to be released to come to the occupation police station "rooms 4", and upon arrival, their IDs and mobile phones are detained, and then they are offered the conditions for the release of their children, among the conditions: not to gather, not to raise flags and banners, not to fire prisoners and female captives are provided with a financial guarantee in case of breaking the conditions, which is an amount of 70 thousand shekels .

Violations against Holy institutions and events

Targeting educational institutions in Jerusalem

The occupation authorities continue to target educational institutions in Jerusalem and tighten the noose on Jerusalemite students, whether by search, arrest or incitement in the corridors of the occupation Knesset. during the month of November, members of the occupation Knesset incited during a session against Jerusalemite school students, describing them as "murderers roaming the streets", that students under the age of 12 are "potential saboteurs", and that the education system in East Jerusalem is "a bloody system and a monster that will wake up at any time". During the meeting, the head of the post police station of the occupation (Kedem) also called for the intensification of the punishment of minors and teenagers in Jerusalem, and not just home detention.

The so-called Education Committee in the Knesset of the occupation agreed to pass a list of the names of schools that they consider to be inflammatory. It was also called for imposing a punishment of thirty years of captivity on every holy teacher who "practices incitement. This incitement came under the supervision of Knesset member Amit Halevi and other members of the far-right in Occupied Jerusalem.

During the month of November, the occupation authorities also closed the Al-Aqsa Islamic school and kindergarten for a week, and arrested the school principal along with one of the students after assaulting and inspection him, under the pretext of the presence of the word "Hammas" on one of the walls, and the occupation demanded the school administration to paint all the walls of the school, not just the wall on which the word was written, and threatened the school staff if he spoke to the media about the closure.

On November 7, the occupying forces forced school students to get off the buses and searched them at the entrance to the town of Issawiya in Occupied Jerusalem.

On November 8, the Israeli occupation forces attacked a woman and her child during the Storming of the Shuafat camp north of Occupied Jerusalem.

The occupying forces attacked school students during their storming of the Shuafat camp in Occupied Jerusalem.

On November 16, the occupation forces arrested a graduate student at Birzeit University, "Fairuz Salama" from the town of Anata, after breaking into her residence and destroying its contents in the town of Birzeit, north of Ramallah.

On November 6, the occupation forces stormed the Rashidiya School, arrested 3 of its students, assaulted some students and administrative staff, and summoned one of the teachers for investigation.

On November 18, the occupation forces targeted the "Isawiya boys" school with gas and sound bombs, where some students suffered cases of suffocation, fractures, shrapnel and panic, while the students were present in the square, field treatment was provided to dozens of them, some teachers were also injured, two fractures were recorded for two students, and several injuries were transferred for treatment in the hospital.

Obliteration of the holy city landmarks:

On November 23, Israeli municipal crews hung Israeli flags on the fence of the Yosef cemetery near Bab al-Asbat Road in Occupied Jerusalem. It is noteworthy that since the seventh of October, the occupation has massively deployed and hung its flags in Occupied Jerusalem in an unprecedented way.

Holy institutions

On November 2, the occupying forces stormed Al-Makassed Hospital in Occupied Jerusalem, and arrested 11 Palestinians from the Gaza Strip, who were accompanying patients from the Strip, who were present at Al-

Makassed Hospital for treatment, and a person from Ramallah, under the pretext of "illegal presence in Jerusalem," and after an investigation for hours released most of the detainees.

On November 3, the occupation forces stormed the Al-Rayyan printing press in the Qalandia camp north of Occupied Jerusalem, and the occupation forces arrested its owner, Muhannad Al-Rayyan, and sentenced him to administrative imprisonment.

Violations against journalists

On November 2, the occupation police imposed severe violations on the vehicle of photojournalist Abdul Karim Darwish from the town of Beit Hanina in Occupied Jerusalem, coinciding with his undergoing a trial, and then released him on the condition of two weeks of house arrest and financial bail.

On November 3, the occupation forces arrested the photojournalist Hamza naaji while performing his journalistic work in Wadi al-Joz in Occupied Jerusalem, and then released him on the condition of house arrest for five days and confiscation of his mobile phone.

On November 17, the occupation forces attacked the Turkish TRT crew during their coverage of the suppression of worshippers in Occupied Jerusalem, and the occupation forces also arrested the Jerusalem photojournalist Abdul amnesty Bassam zghir.
